Keep Your Pets Safe When It's Bitter Cold Outside

- ✓ Bring your pets inside during cold weather
- ✓ Protect their paws
- ✓ Take care of their coat and skin
- ✓ Antifreeze is a deadly poison (clean it up!)
- ✓ Know your pet's limits outdoors
- ✓ Check your engine (make sure no one is hiding under your car!)
- ✓ Use space heaters with caution (heater can burn your pet or be knocked over)
- ✓ Watch for hypothermia
- ✓ Be prepared (emergency kits!)
- ✓ Avoid walking on frozen water (falling through hazard!)
